.....where I graduated with Distinction and top of my class. My MA research titled, ".....," won several international awards/grants like ...... I have gone ahead to publish papers and presented my research at several conferences.

My proposed research aligns with one of the pillars of Social Justice and Praxis Orientation of this program, as these young leaders after being trained in the West, return to Africa to become change agents. In the course of training young people in leadership skills, I have made some interesting observations which I would like to further explore. I observe that ......Just as more international fellowships continue to spring up, so do these young people become motivated to start NGOs and Social Enterprises as they are seen as rewards, while others have migration plans. Public diplomacy would be employed as the framework of this study. Bátora (2005: 4) earlier described public diplomacy as "all activities by state and non-state actors that contribute to the maintenance and promotion of a country's soft power".Pajtinka (2019) defined public diplomacy as a set of complex activities carried out or supported by a state that focuses on influencing public opinion abroad to reach or promote a certain foreign policy goal. He argues that it uses communication based on one way messaging rather than dialogue.

In the past five decades, significant effort has been put into funding and other resources in Africa's development geared at economic growth, social and political stabilization. (ICD 2011). Most of these support comes as foreign aid. Thapa (2020) argues that foreign aid increases dependency and donors can interfere with economic and political activities of a receiving country. On the other hand, this study states that foreign aid improves a country's image and helps to promote peace. While most researchers have focused on the impact of Western Public Diplomacy in Africa, not much has been done concerning the influence these international opportunities have on Young African change makers who are future leaders of the continent. A study like this is of uttermost importance as Africans are on the receiving end. Just as there is an increase in the number of international programs, it is not a coincidence that there is also an increase in the number of businesses and social enterprises that are springing up. This research will be of benefit to the Canadian authorities in maintaining a reciprocal relationship with experts across Africa through the provision of such opportunities and how holders have been able to give back to their communities through this avenue thereby impacting immensely in their local regions and by implication the world. I hope to develop a reliable instrument that will help to measure the impact of such fellowships on the participants.
